## **EXHIBIT “A”**

Minutes of the Streets Committee Held February 1, 2010 at 7:05 pm.

The record will show all members of the Committee were present as well as all members of the Administration. Members of the press were on hand as well as a large contingent of residents from North Pointe and Dodge Drive area.

Carl Ondraka, 464 Northpointe Blvd., gave an overview of their position touching on signage, residential speed limits and crosswalks. Various residents of North Pointe Development provided supportive arguments and rationale for removal of the gate/barrier.

Assistant Law Director, A. Lieberman responded to legal questions related to case history provided for consideration by North Pointe residents.

Dodge Drive residents provided counterpoints related to single entrance, safety for children in the Dodge area without sidewalks, and desire to maintain integrity of pre-existing neighborhood.

Councilman, J. Gambish, Ward 3 spoke at length on the sub-dividers agreement, traffic flow issues around the Sunoco station on Rt. 58, and the fact that the issue for discussion cannot be brought before council on an annual basis.

Councilman-at-Large, F. Janik vocalized concerns related to the increased traffic pattern and conflicting information he has received from the contractor/builder of the sub-division.

Council-at-Large, VanTreuren recognized merit of both North Point and Dodge drive residents who had vocalized their concerns.

Mayor Taylor indicated that the gate in question was “never supposed to be a temporary gate” and “as an Administrator it is a pain in the neck.”

Council-at-Large T. Traster spoke of a change to R3 zoning and the burden to the Dodge Drive traffic flow. He expressed a desire to maintain the integrity of the older neighborhood.

Council-at-Large, J. Gambish motioned to kill the item in committee. This was seconded by Councilwoman J. Wasilk and affirmed by Councilman: Bukovac; Gambish; VanTreuren, Waslik; Traster. Nay votes were cast by Councilman Janik and Loughrie. Motion carried 5-2 to kill item in committee.

Motion to adjourn was made by Councilman Traster and seconded by Councilman Janik. Motion carried unanimously. Committee adjourned at 8:40 P.M.
